**2.2.1 Learner's Level: (Report of Department of English from 2014-17 Batch to 2020-23 Batch)**

The department has the practice to identify the Advanced, Medium and Slow learners in the first semester itself, and constantly follow up these students in their level of competency. Soon after the bridge course, which is conducted separately for both the BA and MA students, by the concerned teachers, which is formally intended to orient the students into the course and to bridge the gaps if any, and to fill the students with the minimum background information needed for the course, there is a tradition of the department to conduct an exam based on the classes taken in the bridge course. Along with that, the classroom performance of each student is evaluated by the concerned teachers, which is converted into marks based on three criteria viz., marks of twelfth class, a writing skills, where the students are asked to write two short essays on general topics and their performance in speaking, where they are asked to introduce themselves in the class and/or later met by the teachers in person. The same is the pattern for both UG and PG, yet the syllabus of the bridge courses and the question papers of the two are different.

(Note: Expansion of the abbreviations: AL: Advance Learner, ML: Medium Level Learner, SL: Slow Learner.

Exam Marks given in the column is the marks for the Bridge course exam, which is conducted in each year, which is conducted as 25 MCQ questions and is calculated out of 50. Class Performance is the aggregate of twelfth class marks calculated out of 25 along with written and speaking competency of the student, calculated out of 25 which altogether makes it to 50. Total marks is out of 100, and in which the students who are scored above 80 are considered as Advanced Learners, between 60-80 are considered Medium Level Learners and below 60 are the Slow Learners. The Question paper and syllabus of the bridge course is attached towards the end of this document).

However, the students have the option to answer the questions either in English or in Malayalam.</p> <p><b>Course Structure:</b> The UG programme shall include five types of courses, viz. Common Courses (Code A), Core courses (Code B), Complementary courses (Code C), Open Course (Code D) and Audit courses (Code E).</p> <p><b>Common Courses:</b> In general, every UG student shall undergo 10 common courses (0401-20 credits) chosen from a group of 14 common courses listed in the UG Regulation, for completing the programme.</p> <p><b>Core Courses:</b> Core courses are the courses in the major (core) subject of the degree programme chosen by the student. There are 24 Core courses in the BA Economics programme.</p> <p><b>Complementary courses:</b> Complementary courses cover 'Indian Constitution and Politics' and 'Mathematical Tools for Economics', distributed in the first four semesters. There is only one complementary course in a semester for B.A. Programmes. The complementary courses study by the students of the department in first and fourth semester (Indian Constitution and Politics) and second and third semester (Mathematical Tools for Economics).</p> <p><b>Open courses:</b> Open courses are the courses offered by a department to the students of other departments. 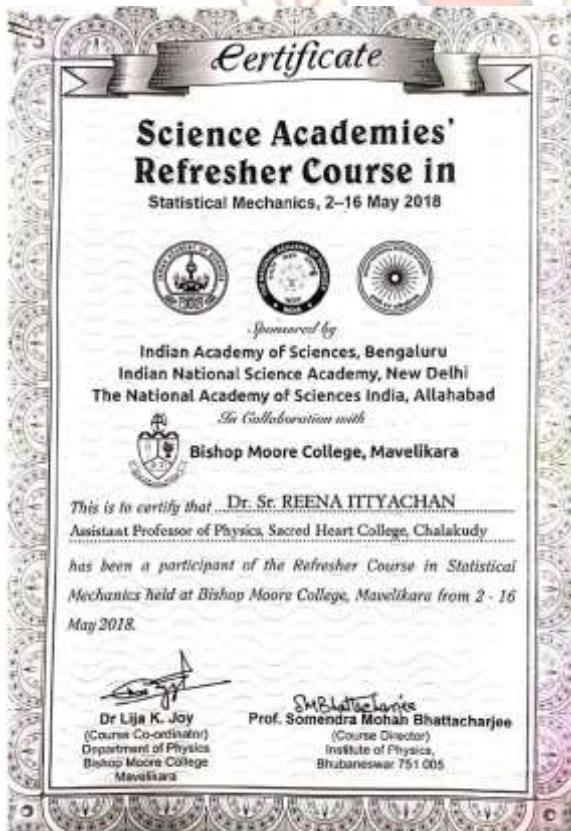

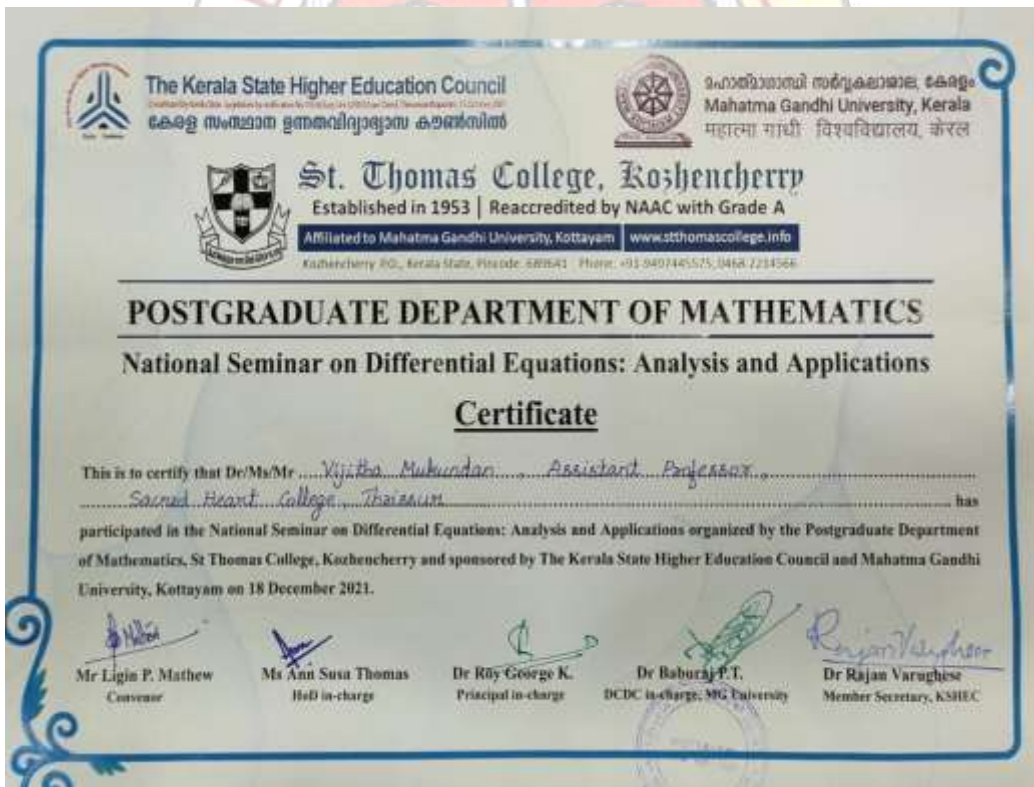
