
#### **OBSERVANCE OF IMPORTANT DAYS AND EVENTS**

National Science Day (NSD-2017) was observed in the Sacred Heart College on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017 to mark the discovery of the Raman effect by Indian physicist Sir Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman. A workshop is organized by the Department of physics of the college under the title "*Innovative Experiments using ExpEYES17*" and was based on the focal theme "Science and Technology for Specially Abled Persons". ExpEYES 17(Experiments for Young Engineers and

Scientists) is a hardware and software framework for developing science experiments, demonstrations and projects. It is the latest product from the PHOENIX (Physics with Home-made Equipment & Innovative Experiments) project, of the Inter-University Accelerator Centre, New Delhi. It converts PC into a science laboratory. It supports a wide range of experiments suitable for B.Sc and M.Sc. courses. Design of all equipment is open and the software is freely distributed.

Dr. Ajith Kumar B P, Scientist, Inter-University Accelerator Center, New Delhi was the resource person. Mr. Jithunath, a young expert in the field also assisted in the hands-on sessions.

The program started at 10.00 a.m in the college seminar hall. The Head of the Department of Physics welcomed the gathering and introduced the resource person. Dr. Sr. Reena Ittyachan, the Principal, gave a short message and wish all the success of the program. Dr. Ajith Kumar B P gave the Science Day message. Dr. Jolly Thomas V, Department of Zoology felicitated the function. There were around 160 participants including teachers and students from various institutions.

The inaugural session was followed by the presentation on the "ExpEYES17" by Dr. Ajith Kumar B P. He introduced the latest version of the ExpEYES kit and explained its key features. Different levels of science experiments were demonstrated using the kit. The programming of the device for the new experiments is also discussed. After the presentation, the participant had an active interaction with the resource person.

The afternoon session was dedicated to hands-on training for the participants. Six sets of experimental setups were arranged in the physics lab and

participants are grouped conveniently. The training to install the required software is given first, followed by different science experiments. There were 60 selected participants for the hands-on session. The session concluded at 5.00 pm.

National Science Day (NSD-2018) was observed in the Sacred Heart College on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2018 to mark the discovery of the Raman effect by Indian Physicist Sir Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman. The events were organized under the title "*National Science Day -2018*" and were based on the focal theme "*Science and Technology for sustainable future*". The Department of physics of the college organized the programs under the sponsorship of the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) which is supported by "The Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India".

Prof. M K Jayaraj, Professor, Department of Physics, Cochin University of Science and Technology (CUSAT), Kochi, Dr. Joe Jacob, Asso. Professor, Newman College, Thodupuzha, Dr. Nijo Varghese, Asst. Professor, Sacred Heart College, Chalakudy were the resource persons.



The inaugural function started at 9.30 a.m in the college seminar hall. The session began with a prayer by Sr. Bineetta Thomas. Dr. Salini Jose, Department of Physics welcomed the gathering and Dr. Sr. Reena Ittyachan, Principal, presided over the function. The seminar was inaugurated by Dr. M.K. Jayaraj. In his inaugural address, he emphasized the main objectives and importance of National Science Days quoting the scientific achievements and attitude of Sir C V Raman. Dr. Tessy K L, Department of Zoology felicitated the meeting. Ms. Jomol Joy, *Physics Association Secretary*, proposed vote of thanks at the end of the inaugural session. There were around 120 participants for the programs.

The inaugural session was followed by the presentation on the "Heterojunctions for light-harvesting and light generation" by Dr. M K Jayaraj. He explained the basic ideas of LED and photovoltaics and current developments in the field. After the presentation, the participants had an active interaction with the resource person.



The second lecture was on "Recent advances in Astrophysics" by Dr. Joe Jacob. He gave an account of the recent developments in the gravitational-wave discovery and the details of the recovery of "Saraswathy", the largest supercluster of the galaxy. He also introduced the different opportunities available for those who are willing to pursue a career in Astronomy.



In the evening session, the participants were given training for the night sky watching by Dr. Nijo Varghese with the aid of the virtual sky demonstration software, Stellarium. The basic concepts of the astronomical coordinate systems, various constellations, positions and properties of planets and other observable deep sky objects were also introduced.


## Wetlands for disaster risk management on 16<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2017

### Independence Day commemoration by Department









**Independence Day celebrations, 2021**







Mahatma Gandhi is not just a name, but the spirit of profound wisdom and captivating from the wear't just a mere political philosopher but he gave a message and philosophy of life. Though not supported by any specific authority, he led an entire nation on the path to independence. With his philosophies of non-violence, truth, self-sufficiency, communal harmony, simple living, and high thinking, he aimed for peace and harmony of the nation along with independence at the same-time.

Today, even a century later, one can see the relevance of Mahatma Gandhi's philosophies not only in India but also on a global level. Gandhi's philosophies, economic and political, find relevance in today's scenario troubled by recession, unemployment, violence, wars, famine and even environmental degradation.
