

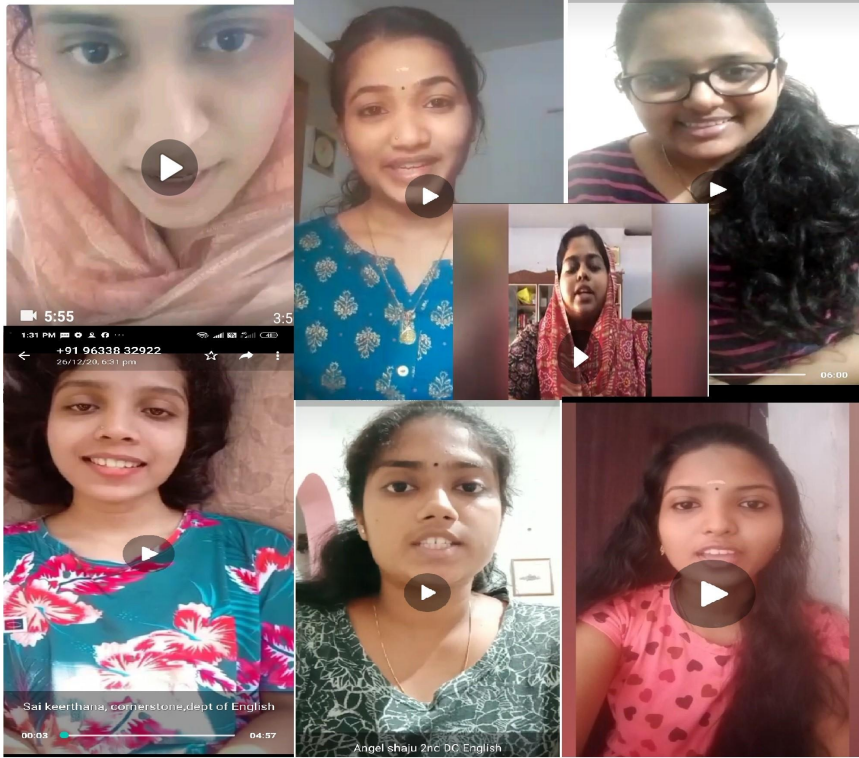
GANDHI JAYANTHI

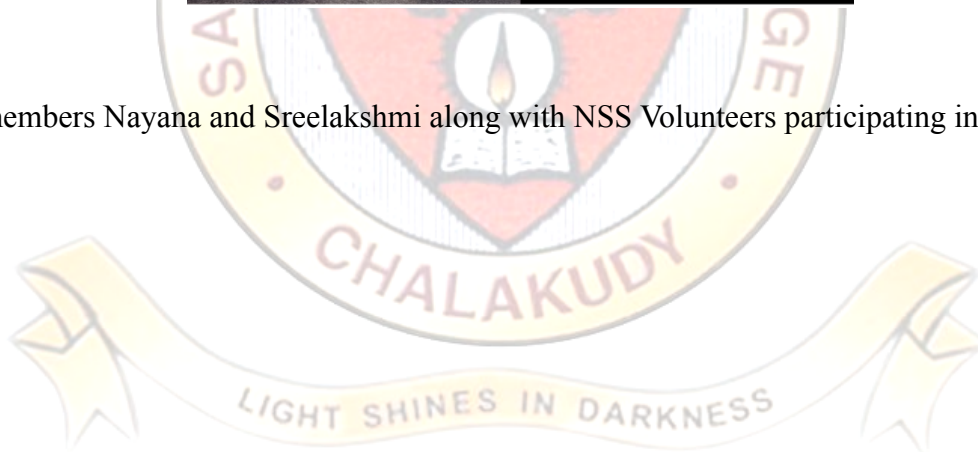

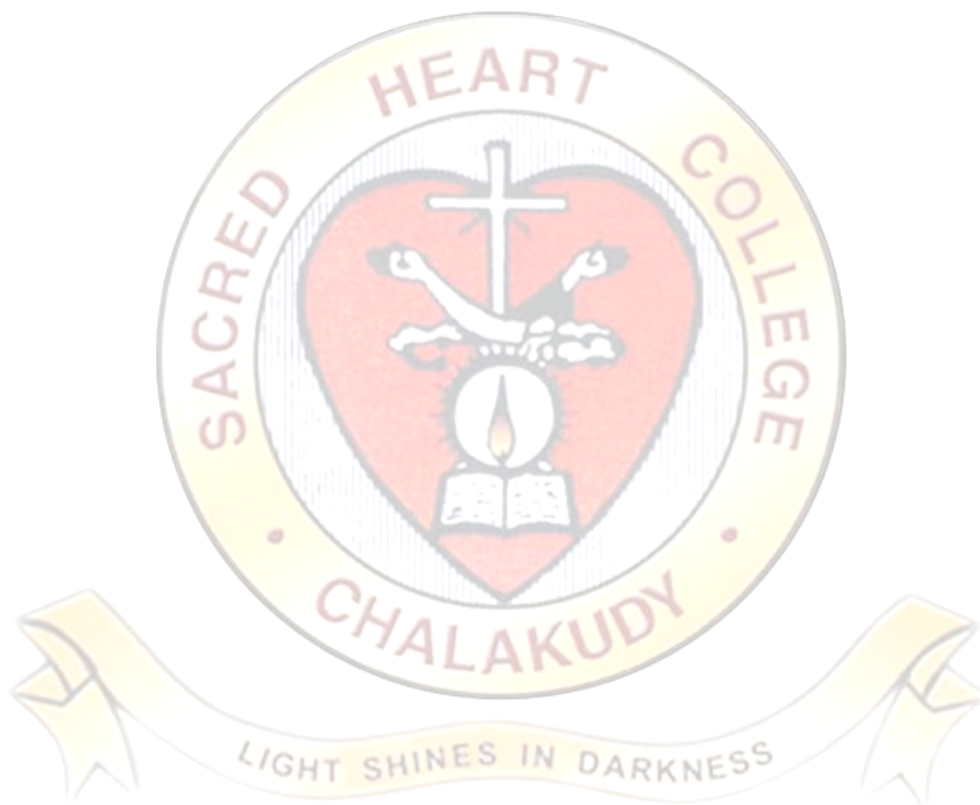
